## A BYLAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MERVIN \#499 TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Mervin \#499, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Definitions:
(a) "highway" means a road, parkway, driveway, square or place designed and and intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles, does not include any area, whether privately or publicly owned, that is primarily intended to be used for the parking of vehicles and the necessary passageways on that area: as defined in the Traffic Safety Act, Chapter T-18.1 of the Statutes of Saskatchewan, 2004.
(b) "motor vehicle" means a vehicle propelled or driven by any by means other than by muscular power; as defined in the Traffic Safety Act, Chapter T-18.1 of the Statutes of Saskatchewan, 2004.
2. No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a speed greater than 70 km per hour on that portion of the highway known as the Marshall Road described as follows:

That portion of Range Road 3203 North from Saskatchewan Provincial Secondary Highway \#3 to Township Road 515 A.
That portion of Township Road 515A East from Range Road 3203 to 3202A.
That portion of Range Road 3202A North from Township Road 515A to
Township Road 520.
3. Signs indicating the maximum speed shall be erected at the commencement of the speed zone area and signs shall be erected showing the end of the speed zone area.
4. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon the date of passage.
